DIOCESE OF LANSING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION NOW

OPEN! The Diocese of Lansing Scholarship program is a need-based assistance program. Need is determined by an independent, third party service, F.A.C.T.S., which makes its assessment based on income and tax information. However, the FACTS application does have a section that offers the family to list any changes in their financial situation, *and these are taken into consideration by the individual schools.*

Grant Criteria eligibility for all grants:

Families must complete a FACTS financial aid application online **on or before March 1, 2020.**

Student must show a financial need of at least \$750.00

The Student must be Catholic, attend a Diocese of Lansing school, and belong to a parish in the Diocese of Lansing.

Diocese of Lansing Grants available for the 2020/2021 school year:

Diocese of Lansing Grant:

Grades K-8 \$750.00 per student Grades 9-12 \$1000 per student

The Venerable Augustus Tolton Scholarship:

Grades K-12 \$500.00 In addition to the Grant Criteria for all grants, student must be African-American or Black and show a need of at least \$500.00

All grant applications must be completed by March 1, 2020 online thorough FACTS. By completing the FACTS application, you are applying for all grants available through the Diocese of Lansing. No need to complete an application for each grant.

You will receive a determination letter by May 30th. If you received a grant, your school will be notified and the grant will be sent directly to your school in October of 2020.

Other types of scholarships and grants also are available, depending on your school or parish. We encourage all families to meet with the tuition advisor of the school in which they intend to enroll so that all avenues of financial assistance can be explored.

Applying for Financial Aid

There is a \$30.00 fee payable to FACTS through their online application process. Applicants can complete the online form by clicking the FACTS link here: <u>https://online.factsmgt.com/aid</u>

The link will be available December 1, 2019 and will close March 1, 2020. The **deadline for applications is March 1, 2020**. *After March 1, 2020 please contact your school directly.*

Once the FACTS online form has been completed, the following information will need to be submitted to FACTS:

 \cdot Copies of your most recent Federal tax forms including all supporting tax schedules and W2's.

• Copies of supporting documentation for Social Security Income, Welfare, Child Support, Food Stamps, Workers' Compensation, and TANF.

All supporting documentation must be uploaded online through the FACTS online form.

Applying for one does not mean that you can't apply for the other. (The St. Mary scholarship will not be ready until after the first of the year.)

MRS. VILLEGAS' CLASSES

We just completed our infamous Math Games day this week which was extremely successful! The 6th grade worked with the Kindergarten and first grade classes, the 7th grade partnered with the 2nd and 3rd grade classes, and the 8th graders played their games with the 4th and 5th graders! It was great to see their creativity and participation with the younger groups.



In the 7th Grade Science class we are exploring the scientific phenomena of Meiosis and Mendel's Punnet Square to identify the probability of genotypes and phenotypes of organisms. We just completed a classroom traits survey to view how many of us have the dominant and recessive traits such as a hitchhiker's thumb, curly or straight hair, blue/gray or brown eyes, etc.

This week depending on our current schedule, we will be building our Mishi Marshmallow Creatures based on the genotypes the 7th graders receive from the parent Mishi creatures!




K-1st grade are working on their underhand throw and we are continuing to develop our basic locomotor skills.



















Project Healthy Schools Wellness Tip: February is National Heart Health month. Making sure your heart is in tip top shape is essential for living a

The feast of the Presentation invites us to celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ into the world. We remember Jesus' coming as the very visitation of God, offering salvation and light to all nations.

The Old Testament reading tells of the Lord's coming to the temple. God's people who have lost their way are called to correct their behavior. They must be purified and made ready for the Lord's appearance.

This gospel shows that Jesus is part of a family that is faithful to God's law. In keeping with the Law of Moses, Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to the temple to present him to the Lord. Simeon and Anna, two faithful people of Israel, recognize Jesus as the Son of God.
