




Take it to Christ Encourage in Faith Speak the Truth




#### Virtue of the Month:

"Blessed are the merciful, they shall obtain mercy" (Matthew 5:7). Whenever we are hurting—either through our own fault or because something bad has happened to us—we want relief...we want MERCY! Jesus has told us that we must show mercy in two ways: physically (for the body) and spiritually (for the soul). When we feed someone who is hungry, we show mercy; when we forgive someone who has hurt us, we show mercy. Jesus showed us this mercy when He forgave sins (spiritual) and cured the sick (physical). As Jesus did, so we must do. Blessed are the MERCIFUL!

**Saint of the Month** for Preschool to grade 2: Saint John Vianney. Feast day is August 4<sup>th</sup>

Saint Faustina grew up in a big family in Poland and joined the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy when she was a young woman. She was always mindful of how others suffered and wanted to help them. She offered many sacrifices, sufferings, and prayers of r souls who needed God's mercy. Many times she did not know the souls for whom she was suffering. On February 22, 1931, Our Lord appeared to

St. Faustina in a vision and instructed her to pain Him as He appeared to her and include the motto, "Jesus, I trust in you." He wanted her to proclaim the message of His mercy—Divine Mercy—to the whole world, which she faithfully did until her death.


**Saint of the Month** for Middle School: Saint Teresa of Calcutta. Feast Day is September 5<sup>th</sup>.




"At the end of our lives, we will not be judged by...how many great things we have done. We will be judged by 'I was hungry and you gave me to eat. I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless and you took me in." Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu was born in the country of Albania and let home at the age of 18 to join the Sisters of Loreto as a missionary. By 1929, she was assigned to a girls' school in Calcutta, India, where she spent many happy years teaching. It was in 1946 that she experienced an encounter with Christ that led her to dedicate her life to serving the poorest of the poor in imitation of the mercy of Jesus. With permission, she left her religious community, trading the habit of the Sisters of Loreto for a plain white sari

bordered with blue. Very soon, young Indian women came to join her—including some of her former students—and her new community became

known as the Missionaries of Charity. Throughout the remainder of her life, Mother Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity would spread the mercy of Christ throughout the world, attending to the needs of the most abandoned and neglected of our brothers and sisters.

# Carry this thought in your heart as a guide for your faith journey this week.

2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23 John 3:14-21

In the Old Testament reading God shows mercy and compassion for the people of Israel. By God's grace, Israel's return from exile is made possible. Because the people of Israel chose to turn away from their relationship with God, they suffered disasters and misfortunes. This passage shows that God does not forget the chosen people. Permission to return to the land and to rebuild the temple is a sign of God's grace and reconciliation.



The gospel reveals why God sent Jesus into the world. The world is in need of healing so God sent his only Son, so that the world might be saved through him. God sent Jesus to give eternal life to all those who believe in him. This gospel makes clear that it is our choice to either believe in or reject Jesus. We bring judgment upon ourselves by choosing darkness rather than light. Both Old and New Testament readings remind us that God is merciful and kind. God's grace makes living in the light possible for all believers.
