






Virtue of the Month:

Mercy: meaning: caring for those who suffer.

"Blessed are the merciful, they shall obtain mercy" (Matthew 5:7). Whenever we are hurting—either through our own fault or because something bad has happened to us—we want relief...we want MERCY! Jesus has told us that we must show mercy in two ways: physically (for the body) and spiritually (for the soul). When we feed someone who is hungry, we show mercy; when we forgive someone who has hurt us, we show mercy. Jesus showed us this mercy when He forgave sins (spiritual) and cured the sick (physical). As Jesus did, so we must do. Blessed are the MERCIFUL!

Saint of the Month for Preschool to grade 2: Saint John Vianney. Feast day is August 4th



Saint John Vianney spent hours and hours hearing peoples' Confessions so they could receive the mercy of Jesus and be happy.

Saint of the Month for grades 3-5: Saint Faustina. Feast Day is October 5th



Saint Faustina grew up in a big family in Poland and joined the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy when she was a young woman. She was always mindful of how others suffered and wanted to help them. She offered many sacrifices, sufferings, and prayers of r souls who needed God's mercy. Many times she did not know the souls for whom she was suffering. On February 22, 1931, Our Lord appeared to

St. Faustina in a vision and instructed her to pain Him as He appeared to her and include the motto, "Jesus, I trust in you." He wanted her to proclaim the message of His mercy—Divine Mercy—to the whole world, which she faithfully did until her death.

Saint of the Month for Middle School: Saint Teresa of Calcutta. Feast Day is September 5th.



"At the end of our lives, we will not be judged by...how many great things we have done. We will be judged by 'I was hungry and you gave me to eat. I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless and you took me in." Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu was born in the country of Albania and let home at the age of 18 to join the Sisters of Loreto as a missionary. By 1929, she was assigned to a girls' school in Calcutta, India, where she spent many happy years teaching. It was in 1946 that she experienced an encounter with Christ that led her to dedicate her life to serving the poorest of the poor in imitation of the mercy of Jesus. With permission, she left her religious community, trading the habit of the Sisters of Loreto for a plain white sari

bordered with blue. Very soon, young Indian women came to join her including some of her former students—and her new community became

known as the Missionaries of Charity. Throughout the remainder of her life, Mother Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity would spread the mercy of Christ throughout the world, attending to the needs of the most abandoned and neglected of our brothers and sisters.


Small Groups:

10 Things to Teach Your Child About God

Whatever your hopes and dreams are for your child, the more connected they are to the wisdom of God, the better chance your child has of growing into the amazing person you and God want him/her to be. When is the right time to teach your child about God? Now and always. 1. **God's Dream**. God has a dream for you. God created you to become thebest-version-of-yourself! As your father/mother, that's my dream for you too. When you ask me if you can do something or have something, I ask myself if it will help you become a-better-version-of-yourself.

2. **The Wisdom of God**. The more you adopt the wisdom of God the happier you will be. When we reject God's wisdom, in a mysterious way we reject ourselves. Alienation from God is alienation from self. If you are ever unhappy, begin by asking, if there an obstacle between myself and God?

3. **God Answers Our Prayers**. God answers every prayer. Sometimes with a yes, sometimes with a no, sometimes with a maybe, and sometimes with not now. God's answer is always in your best interests. Always. God reasons may not always be apparent, but God always has a reason for what he does.

4. **Decision Making**. When you have a big decision to make, turn to God for advice and wisdom. Constantly seek the answer to this question: God, what do you think I should do?

5. **The Voice of God**. Learn to listen to God's voice. God is always speaking to us in more ways than we can imagine. The question is, are we listening?

6. **Talk to God**. Throughout your day, keep a conversation going with God. Talk to him about what brings you joy and what makes you sad, talk to him about school and work, talk to him about decisions you are making. Just talk to him. When you talk to me, it brings be great joy. When you talk to God it brings him great joy.

7. **God Loves You**. God is your Father. You are a child of God not an orphan of the world. He created you and he loves you no matter what. There are many things in life that change, but not this. Nothing you can do can change God's love for you, or cause him to stop loving you or love you less. When you love someone you want good things for that person, and God wants good things for you even more than you want them for yourself. God values love above everything else. When we are at our best, so do we.

8. **The Spirit of God**. The Spirit of God is tender, caring, courageous, generous, and loving. The spirit of the world is harsh, impersonal, uncaring, fearful, stingy, and selfish. You get to decide which spirit guides and rules your life. One leads to clarity and happiness and the other leads to confusion and misery.

9. **Goodness**. God cherishes goodness and there is a tremendous capacity for good in you. Nurture the goodness that God has placed within you, share it with the people who cross your path, and never stop looking for ways to do the most good for the most people with your life.

10. **Knowing God**. Learning about God fills our souls with joy, and brings clarity to our hearts and minds. Never stop learning about God. And yet, for everything we know about God, it is still just a drop in the ocean compared to what we don't know about God. God is a mystery to be enjoyed and reverenced.

Wisdom is the key to all we hope and dream for our children. By teaching them about God we are teaching them how to connect with the source of wisdom. Teaching your child about God is one of the greatest gifts you can ever give him/her. Next time your child asks for something, rather than saying, "Let me think about that" say "Let me pray about that." Something this simple teaches your child that you consult God in your decisions and will encourage him/her to do the same. ~Matthew Kelly

Carry this thought in your heart as a guide for your faith journey this week.

Exodus 20:1-17 John 2:13-25

In the Old Testament reading God gives the Ten Commandments to the chosen people. God's people consider the Ten Commandments to be a gift given to them by God. Following God's law shows the faithful response of the people to their God. In this passage God commands, "You shall not have strange gods before me. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods."



In the gospel Jesus cleanses the Temple of greed and corruption. Jesus drives out the moneychangers and sellers. When Jesus foretells the destruction and rebuilding of the Temple, the people think he is speaking of bricks and mortar. They don't realize that Jesus is speaking of his own death and resurrection. This gospel concludes by pointing out that Jesus knows the hearts of those he meets. Jesus can see through the lies and false attitudes that work against God's law of love. This passage reminds us that we can ask Jesus to cleanse our hearts as we try to live a moral life.



- Why did God give us the Ten Commandments?
- How do you show respect for holy places?
- Who helps you to make good and loving choices?

The Ten Commandments

The Ten Commandments are part of the covenant God made with the people of Israel. Out of love God chose a particular people and entered into a close relationship with them. The people were given God's Law to show them how to live. God called Moses up to the mountain where he was given the Ten Commandments. God makes a promise to Moses, that if the people keep the commandments, they will be God's own. The people of Israel are called in freedom by the love of God to live in relationship with God and one another. The idea of law is not constricting for the people of Israel. It is just the opposite when seen through the eyes of God's people who have been freed from slavery. God has given the people life. The Ten Commandments help the people to express their love and respect for God, for one another and for themselves. The first three commandments outline Israel's relationship to God, and the last seven deal with relations with one's neighbor. The command to love is at the heart of God's Law.

Christians understand that the Ten Commandments guide us in living a moral life. However, we believe that the perfection of God's Law is found in the New Law given to us by Jesus Christ. The example of Jesus' life, his mission and teaching and the ongoing teaching handed down by his Church through the Spirit, guide us in living as followers of Jesus.



Sacrament Connection

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we are forgiven the sins that we commit after we are baptized. God's Commandments teach us to love and respect God, all people, and ourselves. We sin when we freely choose to do what we know is against God's Law.
